For those that are unaware, the scheduled host of the Detachment's 51st Annual Convention, the Delta Hotels Baltimore Hunt Valley closed their doors on October 31st. Both the Detachment and the hotel staff was just made aware of this sudden and unfortunate occurrence this past September. After a quick scrambling and investigation of several venue options, the new host of the 51st Annual Detachment of Maryland Convention is the Hilton Garden Inn Baltimore White Marsh located at 5015 Campbell Blvd., White Marsh, MD 21236. The business session will convene on June 22, 2024 at 8:00 AM in the Campbell Ballroom located on the first floor. Registration packages will be available on Friday, June 21, 2024, beginning at 5:00 PM. The Cloak Room will be the location for the Convention Package and Membership card distribution throughout the weekend which is located on the first floor adjacent to the Ballrooms. Housing has been secured at both the Hilton Garden and the Hampton Inns. The Hampton Hotel is next to the Hilton Inn and shares the same parking lot. Rooms are available for \$139.00 plus 15.5% tax per night (King-Double). Rooms are available on

request by calling 800-774-1500. All Squadron and Individuals are responsible for making their own reservations directly with the hotel. Use Group Code "Sons of The American Legion" when making reservations. Check-In time is 3:00 PM and Check-out time is Noon. The cutoff date to guarantee a reservation is May 22, 2024. The Hilton Garden Inn will serve as host to the Convention Business Sessions, Registration, Youth Member Meeting, Junior Member Activities, Wii Bowling Tournament, and Hospitality Rooms. The venue host for the Convention Activities including Corn Hole, Horse Shoes, Junior Member Bounce Houses, Gaming Truck, Laps of Love, and the Detachment Cook-out will be Overlea Perry Hall American Legion Post No. 130. All events are scheduled to be outside on the post grounds and if Mother Nature intervenes the events will move inside to the Post Hall. On September 16<sup>th</sup> the Maryland Boys State Committee and Staff meetings were held at Kent Island Post 278. Committee meeting started promptly at 10 am and the staff meeting followed. After the meetings, the crab feast was held, and food and fun was had by all that attended.

Things that were discussed were the need for younger American Legion and Sons of The American Legion members to come on board as counselors, office, security, or medical staff.

For the first time in a very long time the program had zero no shows and had 2 boys show up that the program was not expecting. Along with that we had zero dropouts from the program. Also, the program had 5 boys and one Legionnaire from Europe participate in the program.

City Mentors are boys that have attended and graduated from the Maryland Boys State program. They help the boys adjust to the rigors of this demanding program. The program is in need of those that have graduated from high school in 2021 and 2022. If you know of a boy that your Post or Squadron sponsored, ask them if they would like to be a Boys State City Mentor. Contact the Director of Maryland Boys State/Department Adjutant Russell Myers if you have any questions.

Need to increase participants of Maryland Boys State. One hundred boys attended the program this year, but the program would like more participants. Have you thought about the boys who are home schooled? Contact your local or county school board to find out who they are. Also engage the schools, JROTC, Scouts, etc., to get the word out about this great program.

The program will not raise the tuition cost for 2024. The cost of Maryland Boys

State will be \$425.00 dollars. If your Post or Squadron can raise half or 3/4 of the tuition cost, contact a Post or Squadron near you and ask them if they would like to share the cost of the boy(s).

The dates for the 2024 Maryland Boys State program are 16th to the 22nd of June 2024. The program once again will be held at McDaniel College in Westminster Maryland.

The next meeting will be in late January 2024. Location and time TBD.
